Wolf Loan Box

The Wolf Loan Box provides resources for students to conduct inquiry-based learning. Using resources included in the box, students will gain an interdisciplinary picture of the complex issues surrounding wolf survival and will be able to make informed decisions about their role in our ecosystem. The many books and videos spark investigative learning and challenge students of all levels to analyze complex information. Real artifacts, including a wolf pelt and skull, add a tactile component. Gray Wolves, Gray Matter: Exploring the social and biological issues of wolf survival.

Created by the education staff at the International Wolf Center, a wide variety of interdisciplinary lessons for teaching about the many aspects of wolves and the current issues surrounding their survival. Geared toward grades 6 – 12, the lessons include thorough teacher background information, discussion questions, assessment ideas, student pages and more. *Note:* Updated edition of *Gray Wolves, Gray Matter* will be released soon! P.A.W.S. Online (Projects that Analyze Wolves and Society)

This inquiry-based, online curriculum is arranged in a workbook-style format for middle grades students. Online activities include building food webs, organizing thinking, and researching wolf stakeholder groups. Students will explore, analyze, and evaluate the many sides of wolf-human conflicts and come to informed opinions about plausible solutions. It is FREE, easy to use and contains a variety of teacher supports. Track Wild Wolves

Scientists track wolves using radio signals transmitted from special collars in a technique known as "radio telemetry". Your students can follow a wolf pack's travels through the Superior National Forest like the scientists do using this well-thought-out kit. Students "track" wolves from the classroom by using the easy-to-download location data found at www.wolf.org. Kit includes one map of the research area, complete instructions, thorough background information, and four activities for kids and adults. Extra maps are available for classroom use. Distance Learning: Wolves in you classroom...virtually!

Take your students on a trip to the International Wolf Center in Ely, Minnesota without setting foot outside your own classroom! Classroom study and field experiences combine to reveal wolf biology, north woods ecology, animal tracking, predator-prey dynamics and more, depending on your group's interests. Your group can explore the 6,000-square-foot *Wolves and Humans* exhibit, observe our resident wolves in their forest habitat and track wild wolves using telemetry technology. Learn the how and why of howling and other vocalizations as you howl to wild packs. Teachers of all disciplines and ages can choose from a variety of programs to fit their students' needs and school budget. Come for an afternoon, a slumber party or an intensive week of study. Your students will leave with more than fond memories.
